A Reflection on Psalm 121- Rev. Cory Kemp

Have you ever heard of a Keeping Room? In America in the 1700s, the fireplace was the cooking area and the place people gathered to stay warm. But that area was also the main source of heat in the home. To keep people from getting in the cook's way, the Keeping Room was created. Today it is a space next to the kitchen, where friends and family can gather to keep the cook company while they prepare a meal.

Consider now how many ways God keeps us company each day, no matter what is happening in our lives.

When we are desperate, wondering where the help we need will come from... our help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He steadies our feet and keeps us without slumbering, just as He kept Israel.

When we feel alone...God keeps us near, staying at our sides. Nothing will hurt us, day or night because God will keep us from all evil. The Lord will keep our lives.

When we think that God has walked away from us... the Lord keeps us with Him always, in our going out into the world, and our coming back home....always. God's company is with us from this time on and forevermore.
