From a Pastor's Desk

The magnificent celebration of Ephraim Moravian Church's 170th anniversary was an event that I shall keep as a marvelous memory. It was a gift to have the ability to worship with the congregation from afar.



Despite the beauty of its surroundings, that little coterie of the faithful began their steadfast work against severe odds. The danger of walking across the ice is a metaphor of all they had to accomplish. Eventually they constructed their first building and later, pulled it up the hill with horses. In one form or another, it remains as a place of worship to this day. As an aside, I can't resist telling about the very beginnings of the parish I first served. That little group voted to repurpose a tiny old schoolhouse "as long as the women paid for it." Not much has changed.

This congregation survived some of the most tumultuous eras in all of history. These forbears were not left untouched by world events, of course, nor were they intimidated by their own surroundings. We can imagine they experienced fear and loneliness. Maybe disappointment now and again. Or perhaps despair. But they always had hope. Hope in the future, knowing our Lord was waiting for them. And they had unbounding Faith.

All of what these remarkable people experienced was the warp and the woof of the beautiful fabric they wove together. Those people had grit! And so have all who have been a part of every 170 years!

Speaking of grit, your current Pastor invented it! The whole congregation has the stamina and determination to be "The Church of the Open Door"! As an outsider looking in, I believe that openness has been the catalyst, and the result, of being a strong and vibrant people of God.
