In Celebration of 170 Years

We have seen many pastors over the life of this church. One pastor, who served from 1940 – 1946 had an impact, not only in our congregation, but on the wider church as a Bishop. In fact, He was a spiritual mentor and friend to many, including your current pastor, who met him in the 1970's and had many conversations with him while attending seminary. The following is an excerpt from his diary in January, 1940:

Today is the 15th of January and although we have been here since January 3rd, no day by day record has been kept because I could not find the diary book. Day before yesterday, however, after one last long search I found it under a pile of Christmas decorations. All is ready then to begin the story of whatever joy and sorrow, success and disappointment may befall both pastor and people during the ministry of James and Dorothy Weingarth in the congregations of Ephraim and Sister Bay, Wisconsin.

All beginnings have the appeal of original time and circumstance about them. Our arrival in Ephraim has that for us in an especial way. It means the end of a long journey and the beginning of an encampment, finis to a chapter in the tropics on the foreign mission field, entrance upon whatever length of time we shall have of service in the homeland.

Jimmy Weingarth was a man of deep spiritual insight. His standard greeting was, 'how is it with your soul?' Perhaps we need to ask ourselves the same question now and again... to remind us that our life as a church does not consist only of brick and mortar, but of the Ineffable qualities of the Spirit.
