## **REFLECTION by PASTOR DAN G. OLSON**

I'd never done it before. Retire, that is. For thirty-five years in parish ministry, plus eight years of preparing before that, my whole identity was wrapped up in what I did and being called "Pastor". What was to become of me?

Soren Kierkegaard said, "Life can only be understood backward, but it has to be lived forward." There's no question I had fallen into the trap of steering through life fixating on the rearview mirror. Now I was being called to look forward, to forage through uncharted territory on a new journey. It didn't take long for me to embrace other distinctions to define me. "Husband" of course; "Father," "Grandpa," "Reader," "Cook," "Lazy." Retirement wasn't so bad after all.

In the Book of Exodus, we read of Moses and the people of God being called to enhanced service and mission. They hadn't a clue as to what that meant or where they were going. But of this we can be certain, God said, "You shall be my own possession among all people ... and you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation!" You can be sure they proceeded with fear and trepidation, but they said, "All the Lord as spoken we will do."

So, on they went. Lead by a pillar of cloud by day, and a pillar of fire by night.
