#### Reflection

"You will indeed listen, but never understand, and you will indeed look, but never perceive."

This verse came to mind on one of my walks. It was one of those spectacular Door County summer days. A cool breeze was blowing, the water sparkled, the moon was still visible against a clear blue sky. As I made my way around the benches at the shore, already beginning to fill with people, I spied a young couple was seated on a bench. They were obviously on vacation, judging by the clothes they were wearing. But instead of being captivated by the beauty around them or each other, both heads were buried in their respective cellphones. I had to wonder what could be so important that all this beauty and their own relationship could be set aside for such banality.

But then I had to wonder about my own lack of focus on the things that are important to my health and well-being, physically, mentally and spiritually. How many times have I not understood or perceived because my attention was elsewhere? There are so many things in modern life that cause us to focus our attention on banality. How many hours are spent in front of the computer? How many hours are spent on trivial things, while the beauty of nature, the solace of friendships, the soul-restoration of prayer and meditation, the joy of learning are set aside? Even on vacation, which is supposed to help us mend our fractured lives, we can fill the time with things that do not heal. Many in this community have not taken vacation yet. This is our 'busy time'. Yet, we have an opportunity that is rare in the working environment. We can look up from the computer screens and see nature's grand display every day! We can get in the car and ride behind a tourist who's meandering through the peninsula and, instead of getting upset, slow down and experience what they are seeing for the first time. There is nothing so urgent that we can't slow down and revel in the goodness, beauty and grace that is all around us. May we 'turn and be healed'!
