From a Pastor's Desk by Dan G. Olson



Until we moved to Northern Wisconsin, I had never heard of farmers going out to pick rocks. I grew up on a farm in Iowa where there was no such thing. Picking corn, of course, but rocks? But it's true. The rocks are picked so they don't damage the plowshare. And to top it off, the rocks are an annual crop. They appear in colder places where the sub-zero temperatures freeze the ground water which forces the rocks to the surface.

One might think of rocks as a nuisance but, in fact, they really are fundamental. Stone fences have been built for centuries. I've been in the basements of older homes where the foundation has been built with rocks. And this gets me to my underlying theme of this article – foundations.

Think with me here about bridges that cross bodies of water: The Michigan Street Bridge, The Mackinaw Bridge, The Brooklyn Bridge for example. The entire weight of the bridge which you can see, is supported by that which you cannot. These structures are known as "piers" which rest on bedrock, many feet below the surface of the water. They are the foundation of the bridge and carry the weight of everything above. Each one of us has a foundation of some kind upon which our lives are built. We are, each one of us, only as sturdy and strong as the foundation upon which we are supported. Some foundations are less than adequate – those built with more sand and fewer rocks.

Might I suggest that with a strong spiritual foundation, we can focus on what is truly essential. This strong foundation is Jesus our Lord, who can support us in every aspect of our lives. As Peter says, in his first New Testament letter:

"Come to him, a living stone, who is precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture, "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." 
