## What is Your Calling?

It seems unreasonable that just because a rabbi, even a powerful one, said "Follow me," that someone would immediately leave their profession. But that appears to have happened and it left repercussions in its wake.

Take Zebedee, for example. Zebedee must have been gob-smacked to watch his sons leave everything to follow Jesus. Likely, the families of all the disciples might have felt the same. "What?" Zebedee might have asked. "I gave you all you have. Taught you how to sail, taught you how to fish, set you up in business! You should walk away already? What will your mother think?"

When I was interested in, and called to, ordained ministry, my mother was very uneasy. Apparently, she had the notion that she would be expected to lead a perfect life and would be held accountable and watched by others. As if I was so perfect.

Let's face it, Jesus is very compelling. To answer his call might be difficult and/or a delight. It is rewarding, I must say. But to answer Jesus' call is not exclusive to public ministry, it is far more expansive than that. By whatever path, everyone is lead into their own future by their own interests and inclinations.
