STARGAZING- Rev. Dan G. Olson

What is more fascinating than becoming engrossed in stargazing? Thus far, I've mastered identifying the Big Dipper, Orion's Belt and The North Star. To this day I cannot find The Little Dipper. It is a gift, however, to observe the vast tableau of God's fingerprints spread across the vaults of heaven in the form of stars. Perhaps you can identify.

For thousands of years people have been pondering the night sky. An array of knowledge has been garnered as a result. The constellations have been identified, for one thing. And, as a result of careful reflection, how we tell time and count years has been clarified. Over time, the abilities and skills of observation have taken quantum leaps, giving us the Webb Space Telescope as an example.

No finer astronomers can be found than "The Wisemen" (also known as The Three Kings) about whom we read in today's Gospel text from Matthew, chapter 2. They became entranced by an astounding star in the east and could not help but follow where it led. The focal point of that star was "the place where the child was". The wisemen could be considered the very first witnesses of Christ our Lord. For all its importance, however, it really wasn't about the star. Rather, the star reveals "The Light of the World."

You are invited also to follow the star, so that it may show you the way to the Babe in the Manger, Jesus, The Light of the World.
