Reflection- Pastor Dawn Volpe

Long before tablets of stone were etched with commandments, long before words were ever penned on parchment, long before prophets spoke on God's behalf... the Word came directly to a man named Abram. He was told to do something outrageous- leave everything behind- the land on which his family lived for generations, the people whom he had known his entire life. Leave everything behind at the age of 75 and follow the voice of God- to where? He wasn't told. Only that he had to leave on the strength of a promise- someday (long after he was dead), a great nation would spring from this moment of faith. We know the ending of the story- Abraham's legacy lives on to this day. Jews, Christians and Muslims all claim a connection to 'Father Abraham.' All because a man had the faith to follow the voice of God. My friend, Cory Kemp, describes faith this way:

Faith is an incredibly large word that invites you to see past what you have experienced and embrace God's vision for you sight unseen.

God is really, really good at dreaming big things for us, offering them to us not as grand gestures, but as promises, covenants, that mean he intends to make good and bring these dreams to life. The ways, the means, the how, are all inconsequential because God will manage all of that. All we have to do is say yes. And keep saying yes, every step of the way forward.

As we continue our Lenten journey, may we step out in Faith- that God continues to dream big things for us. That our lives can affect a generation yet unborn.
