Easter Reflection - Pastor Dan G. Olson

It seemed like the forces of darkness, death and destruction had completed their work and achieved the task before them. This Jesus, who was considered a threat and a blasphemer had finally been tucked away in his tomb, never again able to be a thorn in the side of the establishment and the true religion. And that was that!

As in everything else, God has the first word. Our Lord God spoke everything into existence, including life itself. We must remind ourselves that God never destroys the creation He has made. Further, God always has the last word. Even death couldn't, cannot, never will, deter him.

None of us can truly grasp the wonder and beauty of the Resurrection. In human terms it is an impossibility. But God is not handicapped by human terms. Instead, God ripped the fabric of death to pieces and obliterated its power over our lives. God took his obliterated Son and spoke new life in him. The true nature, life and reality of Jesus was restored. In so doing, he vicariously did the same for us. We too have been set free from the stranglehold of sin and death. To be sure, as life goes on, we will all have burdens and sufferings of a sort. One might say they are the birth pangs of death which deliver us to that day when our Lord will take us by the hand and gently lead us on. On that day, God will whisper in our ear, "Behold, I make all things new!" But even now, through Jesus' Resurrection, He also encourages us by saying, "Behold, I have made all things new for you, now!"

It is our joy and task to announce that Jesus' new life is pervasive among us. The seeds of new life sprout all about us. It is our happy responsibility to invite others along on the journey of life as we are all lifted up in Glory with the Living Lord!
