The interplay between darkness and light is the result of the effects of the cosmos, the natural world, and human involvement. It's obvious, of course, that the earth's rotation gives us our day and night. But there have been other junctions between darkness and light which are more up close and personal. During the time of the Dust Bowl, the incessant winds carried tons upon tons of precious topsoil as far away as the East Coast. The waves of soil were so dense that it became difficult to see hands in front of faces. The genesis of the drought was definitely due to the vagaries of nature. The dust was likely due to improper tilling of the soil. Farmers learned after the fact to use contour plowing. 
