

Jason Anderson was elected as our new District President. Rev. Marian Boyle-Rohloff and Rev. Kerry Krauss were elected as Clergy representatives to the District Executive Board. Angela Sherman is part of the Western District Justice Team, which made a presentation at the Synod. Angela will be sharing her work/vision here at EMC in September. Two important pieces of legislation were passed- giving our youth a stronger presence at Synods and addressing the need to provide unwavering advocacy for victims of sexual misconduct.
