Reflection Rev. Cory Kemp

How does light work? How does light function in our lives? Light works to illuminate our world, our communities, our places of employment, our homes. Some of that is natural light, produced by the sun and shared with everybody on our planet. Some light is humanmade, transforming natural materials born in and of the earth into accessible power sources that are not equally available throughout the world.

And then there is Light, God in through and among us. God illuminates our lives, our very being. God also shines the light forward for each of us so we can keep finding our way, our next right step, without stumbling headlong over whatever the world can leave on our paths. We do, of course, still slip, trip and fall, but perhaps a bit more gently or gracefully than we may have without some semblance of awareness. We all, of course, still operate in our own levels of darkness, still sin, make mistakes, hurt ourselves, other people and generally impact the world in damaging ways. But, perhaps, we cause less havoc than we may have if we were unaware of God's light giving us more room to work.

It may surprise you that twilight, the time of day that the light is slipping away from us, is my favorite time of day. I love twilight because it reminds me that the differentiation of light and darkness is easier to discern as the day settles, the sun begins to lower in the sky and the air often becomes still and clear. Twilight isn't a place to hide, nor a gray area of slipshod morality or easy avoidance of doing what is right without being detected. It is God saying I trust you to carry the Light I have given you today through the night until tomorrow dawns and the Light returns.
