## "The Voice"

"It's so good to hear your voice!" No doubt you've said that, or heard that said, many times. We recognize someone's voice immediately. Of all the people on earth there are none who have exactly the same voice. Jesus picks up on this theme when he speaks of sheep listening to the voice of their shepherd. Even though sheep are not necessarily known for being the brightest bulbs on the tree, they are nevertheless able to recognize the voice of their shepherd and listen to no one else's. I can attest to that because of an experience I had when I was a boy growing up on the farm in Iowa. My dad usually had a flock of sheep he would shear for their wool. One spring I "adopted" a newly born little lamb, or perhaps, the lamb adopted me. Whenever the lamb saw or heard me, he knew I was good for food and friendship. I bottle fed that lamb from practically birth on. Despite being friends, the lamb wasn't above showing a streak of independence. Once, when I had my back turned, the lamb decided to give me a significant rump bump!

"All we like sheep have gone astray, we have turned, each of us, to our own way". It is human nature to assert our independence in order to explore the many labyrinths of this great big world we live in. We are deluged with a cacophony of voices from every side and every angle. Many voices to whom we listen lead us to places of extraordinary danger.

There is one voice that is so distinct, so powerful, so comforting, so encouraging, so hopeful. That is the voice of Jesus, calling us from the din and cacophony of the noise all about us. God says to us, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him!"
